The article by Jason Nicolle refers to a single sheet of paper in the University of Cambridge Library giving population estimates for ten parishes in 1737. No figures were given for St Ouen or St Helier. The information on this sheet is reproduced below (not including breakdown by vingtaine for each parish).
