NOTES.—(1). The Island of Jersey contained 22,855 inhabitants (10,312 Males and 12,543 Females) in 1806, and 22,763 inhabitants (10,496 Males and 12,267 Females) in 1815.

(2). The population at the Censuses of 1821 and 1831 is exclusive of the Military population, of seamen ashore, and of persons on board vessels (naval or mercantile) in waters adjacent to the Island; in 1841 the Military population and seamen (ashore and afloat) were included. The population at each Census, 1851 to 1911, includes the Military population, seamen on shore, and *all persons* on board vessels in port on Census night or arriving the following day. The great increase in population between the Censuses of 1841 and 1851 was largely due to the Government works in progress at the latter date: these works were completed, or abandoned, before the Census of 1861. In 1871 numerous refugees were present in consequence of the Franco-German War.

* Of these 888 uninhabited houses, 458 were "In occupation," that is, utilised for business or other purposes, but without inmates on the Census night. These 458 uninhabited houses in occupation probably included some lock-up shops, offices, &c., which were not included under the term "Uninhabited House" either at any preceding Census or at that of 1911.
